A little bit about Your Trainers for the day... Firstly Gavin Buck. Gavin has been in the sport of IPO for numerous years and has competed with 2 x Rottweilers. Stormhaus Athena and Stormhaus Drago who is his present dog.

Stormhaus Athena was the first Rottweiler to compete and qualify at an international trial, this was at the Rottweil Grand Pre in 2014 where they came joint 9th in the trial of 35 dogs.

Stormhaus Drago is at present the National champion and won the British Rottweiler Sport Dog Club event with best track best obedience and second in the protection round.

Gavin and Drago have just come back from the Rottweiler World championships and also he competed at the All breeds World Championships where he they became the first team from Great Britain to compete and qualify with a tracking score of 90-100 obedience 90-100 and 72-100 in protection work.

Gavin is a former Police Dog Handler and he has worked 2 x Rottweilers and 1 x German Shepherd within the force.

Gavin,s love of the sport began after attending a IPO club some years ago when he wanted to learn about the tracking side of the sport and how to start this type of tracking.

Gavin's love of training all began when he saw that you can use the clicker to train your dog and still to this day he uses it to mark the behaviour he wants from his dog.

"I have 30year's experience training and competing with dogs in a variety of different dog sports. These range from working sheep dog trials and Kennel club working trials, with both Border collies and German Shepherds.
